First Exercise (6 points) Obtaining of Polyvinyl Chloride (PVC)

Polyvinyl chloride or polychloroethene, is obtained by polymerization of the monomer vinyl chloride C_2H_3Cl . Polyvinyl chloride (PVC) is the most used plastic material in the world after polyethene. **Given:** The Lewis electron dot symbols of hydrogen, carbon and chlorine atoms are given below:

1. The element chlorine belongs to the period three of the periodic table.

1.1 - Specify to what column (group) of the periodic table chlorine does belong.

1.2 - Determine the atomic number of the element chlorine.

2. The molecular formula of ethene is obtained by replacing the chlorine atom Cl in the molecular formula of vinyl chloride by a hydrogen atom H.

2.1 - Give the condensed structural formula of ethene.

2.2 - Indicate the type of bond between the carbon atoms of the ethene molecule.

3. Write the structural formula of vinyl chloride.


4. The general equation of the polymerization of a monomer M is given as : $n(M) \longrightarrow (M)_{\overline{n}}$

- Choose, from the following equations, the equation of the polymerization reaction of vinyl chloride.

Second Exercise (7 points) Petroleum

Petroleum is a mixture of hydrocarbons. Petroleum should be treated before it is used. During the refining process, hydrocarbons (A) and (B) are obtained. The following graphs (1) and (2) show the number of carbon and hydrogen atoms in the molecules of (A) and (B).

- 1. Refer to the graphs (1) and (2). Verify that the molecular formula of (A) is C_2H_4 and that of (B) is C_4H_{10} .
- **2.** Identify the family (class) to which each of the above hydrocarbons does belong.
- 3. Write the equation of the complete combustion of hydrocarbon (B).
- **4.** One molecule of hydrocarbon (**A**) reacts with one molecule of chlorine and a compound (**D**) is obtained.
 - 4.1- Explain which of the following two structural formulas (I) or (II) can be associated to compound (D).



(I) (II) 4.2- Indicate whether compound (D) is a hydrocarbon or is not a hydrocarbon. Justify.

Third Exercise (7 points) Galvanic Cell: Zn-Cu

Into a beaker containing copper II sulfate solution (blue color) and a thermometer indicating a temperature 21°C, a strip of zinc is introduced. After a certain time, the thermometer indicates 22°C. A chemical reaction took place. The equation of the reaction is given as:

$$Zn + Cu^{2+} \longrightarrow Zn^{2+} + Cu$$
