## I- ( 2 points) .

In the space referred to a direct orthonormal system $(O ; \vec{i}, \vec{j}, \vec{k})$, consider the line (d) defined by $:\left\{\begin{array}{l}x=t+1 \\ y=-t+2 \\ z=2 t\end{array} \quad\right.$ (t is a real parameter) and the plane $(P)$ of equation $x-y-2 z-5=0$.

1) Determine the coordinates of $E$, the point of intersection of (d) and (P).
2) a- Write an equation of the plane (Q) perpendicular to (d) at E. b- Find a system of parametric equations of the line (D) that lies in plane (P) and is perpendicular to $(\mathrm{d})$ at $E$.
3) $\mathrm{I}(2 ; 1 ; 2)$ is a point on line (d). Determine the coordinates of J , the symmetric of I with respect to $(\mathrm{D})$.

## II-( 3.5 points)

In the plane referred to an orthonormal system $(\mathrm{O} ; \overrightarrow{\mathrm{i}}, \overrightarrow{\mathrm{j}})$, consider the conic $\left(C_{m}\right)$
of equation: $2 m x^{2}+(m+1) y^{2}-8(m-1) x-2 m-1=0$ where $m$ is a real parameter different from -1 .

1) For what value of $m$ would the conic ( $\mathrm{C}_{\mathrm{m}}$ ) be a parabola ? Determine the vertex, the focus and the directrix of this parabola.
2) In this question, let $m=2$.
a- Determine the nature and the center of $\left(\mathrm{C}_{2}\right)$, and find its vertices that lie on the focal axis.
b- The conic $\left(\mathrm{C}_{2}\right)$ cuts the axis of ordinates at the points $G$ and $L$

Write the equations of the tangents to $\left(\mathrm{C}_{2}\right)$ at these two points. c- Calculate the area of the region bounded between $\left(\mathrm{C}_{2}\right)$ and its principal circle.
3) Let $f$ be the function expressed by $f(x)=\sqrt{\frac{3}{2}-x^{2}}$, and designate by (T) its
representative curve in the system $(O ; \vec{i}, \vec{j})$.
a- Prove that $(T)$ is a part of one of the curves $\left(\mathrm{C}_{\mathrm{m}}\right)$.Determine, in this case, the
nature and elements of $\left(\mathrm{C}_{\mathrm{m}}\right)$.
b- Let ( $\mathrm{D} \mathrm{)} \mathrm{designate} \mathrm{the} \mathrm{region} \mathrm{bounded} \mathrm{between} \mathrm{(T)} \mathrm{and} \mathrm{the} \mathrm{axis}$ of abscissas.

Calculate the volume of the solid of revolution generated by the rotation of the
region (D) about the axis of abscissas.

## III- (2 points)

In an oriented plane, consider a direct triangle ABC right angled at A , such that
$\mathrm{AB}=2 \mathrm{~cm}$ and $(\overrightarrow{\mathrm{BC}} ; \overrightarrow{\mathrm{BA}})=\frac{\pi}{3}(2 \pi)$.
Let $\mathbf{S}$ be the direct similitude that transforms A onto B and B onto C .

1) Determine the ratio and the angle of $\mathbf{S}$.
2) a- Construct the point $\mathrm{C}^{\prime}$, the image of $\mathbf{C}$ under $\mathbf{S}$.
(Give the steps of this construction).
b- Calculate the area of triangle $\mathrm{BCC}^{\prime}$.
3) Let O be the midpoint $[\mathrm{AB}]$, and consider the direct orthonormal system
$(\mathrm{O} ; \overrightarrow{\mathrm{u}, \mathrm{v}})$ such that $\overrightarrow{\mathrm{u}}=\overrightarrow{\mathrm{OB}}$.
a- Find the complex form of the similitude $\mathbf{S}$.
b- Determine the affix of point $W$, the center of $\mathbf{S}$.
c- Let $\mathbf{S}^{-1}$ be the inverse transformation of $\mathbf{S}$. Give the complex form of $\mathbf{S}^{-1}$.

## IV- ( 2.5 points)

The complex plane is referred to a direct orthonormal system $(O ; \vec{u}, \vec{v})$.
$\mathrm{A}, \mathrm{B}$ and C designate three points, in this plane, whose affixes are a , $b$ and c respectively.

1) Show that if the triangle $A B C$ is right angled at $B$, then the complex number $\frac{c-b}{a-b}$
is pure imaginary.
2) In this question, suppose that $a=z, b=z^{2}$ and $c=z^{4}$.
a- Solve the equation $z^{4}-z=0$.
b- Find the values of $z$ for which the points $A, B$ and $C$ are distinct in pairs.
c- Prove that when the triangle ABC is right angled at B , then the point $A$ of affix
$\mathrm{z}=\mathrm{x}+\mathrm{iy}$ moves on a conic whose equation and nature are to be determined.

## V- ( $\mathbf{3 , 5}$ points)

An urn contains nine balls :
three white, numbered from 1 to 3
three black, numbered from 1 to 3 three red, numbered from 1 to 3 .

Two balls are drawn, simultaneously and at random, from this urn. Consider the following events :
A : " the two drawn balls carry odd numbers ".
B : " The two drawn balls have the same colour".
C : " The two drawn balls have different colours".
D : " The two drawn balls have different colours and carry two odd numbers".

1) Calculate the following probabilities : $\mathrm{P}(\mathrm{A}), \mathrm{P}(\mathrm{B}), \mathrm{P}(\mathrm{A} \cap \mathrm{B})$ and $\mathrm{P}(\mathrm{A} / \mathrm{B})$.

Are the events A and B independent?
2) a- Calculate $\mathrm{P}(\mathrm{C})$ and prove that $\mathrm{P}(\mathrm{D})=\frac{1}{3}$.
b- The two drawn balls are of different colours, what is the probability that they carry two odd numbers?
3) Let $X$ be the random variable, $(X \geq 0)$, that is equal to the absolute value of
the difference between the numbers carried by the two drawn balls.
Determine the probability distribution of X and calculate the mathematical
expectancy $\mathrm{E}(\mathrm{X})$.

## VI- (7 points)

Let $f_{n}$ be the function defined on IR by $f_{n}(x)=\frac{2 e^{n x}}{1+e^{x}}-1$, where $n$ is a natural integer,
and let ( $\mathrm{C}_{\mathrm{n}}$ ) be its representative curve in an orthonormal system $(\mathrm{O} ; \overrightarrow{\mathrm{i}}, \overrightarrow{\mathrm{j}})$.Unit 2 cm .

A- Suppose, in this part, that $\mathrm{n}=1$ :

1) Calculate $\lim _{x \rightarrow+\infty} f_{1}(x)$ and $\lim _{x \rightarrow-\infty} f_{1}(x)$.
2) Calculate $f_{1}^{\prime}(x)$ and set up the table of variations of $f_{1}$.
3) a- Prove that $O$ is a point of inflection of $\left(\mathrm{C}_{1}\right)$.
b- Write an equation of the line (d) that is tangent to O to $\left(\mathrm{C}_{1}\right)$
4) Draw (d) and ( $\mathrm{C}_{1}$ ).

B- Let $\left(\mathrm{C}_{0}\right)$ be the representative curve of the function $\mathrm{f}_{0}$, corresponding to $\mathrm{n}=0$, in the same system $(\mathrm{O} ; \overrightarrow{\mathrm{i}}, \vec{j})$.

1) Prove that $\left(C_{0}\right)$ is the symmetric of $\left(C_{1}\right)$ with respect to the axis of ordinates.
2) Prove that $\left(\mathrm{C}_{0}\right)$ is the symmetric of $\left(\mathrm{C}_{1}\right)$ with respect to the axis of abscissas.
3) Calculate, in $\mathrm{cm}^{2}$, the area of the region bounded between $\left(\mathrm{C}_{1}\right)$, $\left(\mathrm{C}_{0}\right)$ and the lines of equation $x=0$ and $x=1$.

C- Consider the sequence $\left(U_{n}\right)$ defined by $U_{n}=\int_{0}^{1} f_{n}(x) d x$.

1) Prove that $U_{n+1}+U_{n}=2 \frac{e^{n}-n-1}{n}$.
2) Calculate $\lim _{n \rightarrow+\infty}\left(U_{n+1}+U_{n}\right)$ and deduce that the sequence $\left(U_{n}\right)$ cannot be convergent.
